ELIGIBILITY:

EXPECTATIONS:

Testing will begin in a timely fashion. Contestants will be evaluated on their knowledge of medical terms relating to medical terminology - prefixes, suffixes, combination words, anatomy and physiology by answering multiple choice questions.

SCOPE OF CONTEST:

1. There will be two test taking sessions, 9:00am and 10:15am. Each test taking session will last one hour. Contestants will be placed in one session during the registration process.
2. Contestants will report to their assigned zoom meeting 5 minutes prior to their session.



- Contestants will take an online test using Kahoot consisting of multiple choice questions on commonly found medical word roots, prefixes and suffixes will be provided with 100 questions.

Judging Criteria:

- Accuracy of written test and labeling of diagram
- Contestants with the three highest scores will win.
- In the event of a tie, the order will be based on two tie-breaker questions
