OVERVIEW

Careers in the Public Services sector fall into three pathways: Public Safety; Emergency Response; and Legal Practices.

In 2019, there were a total of 24,924 jobs in the Fresno, Tulare, and Kings County region, and 30.9 percent of those jobs in Local Government, including Education and Hospitals.
